



Manitoba Hockey Hall of Fame Hockey Scholarships Ken "Friar" Nicolson Award Sami-Jo Small Award Fred Stevenson Award

The Manitoba Hockey Hall of Fame and Museum will be awarding scholarships to outstanding high school hockey players. The awards will be selected by a committee representing the Hockey Hall of Fame, are named in honour of the late Ken "Friar" Nicolson, former CJOB Hockey Broadcaster and member of the first Provincial "AAAA" High School Hockey Committee, and National Female Team player Sami-Jo Small who was an outstanding high school athlete at College Jeanne-Sauve.

The Fred Stevenson Award, named in honour of the former Winnipeg High School Hockey Coach, is sponsored by Leigh Gruener the daughter of Fred Stevenson.

Ken "Friar" Nicolson Award: (\$1,000.00) is presented to the most qualified male applicant.

Sami-Jo Small Award: (\$1,000.00) is presented to the most qualified female applicant.

Fred Stevenson Award: (\$1000.00) is presented to the most qualified applicant, not gender specific.

All applications must include:

Completed application form (including applicant's e-mail address)

Letter from the applicant outlining their future education plans.

Letter of reference from:

1. High School Hockey Coach
2. A member of the administrative staff of the school the applicant attends.

The Applications are assessed with respect to:

1. Academic record
2. Hockey excellence
3. Athletic achievement
4. Community Involvement

Each team is eligible to nominate a player to be considered for these scholarships. Only graduating grade 12 students may apply.

ELIGIBILITY

Must be in good standing at the school, taking at least two (2) grade 12 level courses during each school term.
Graduating grad 12 students only (repeaters not eligible)
Must enroll in the next ensuing academic year at a recognized Canadian university or community college.
